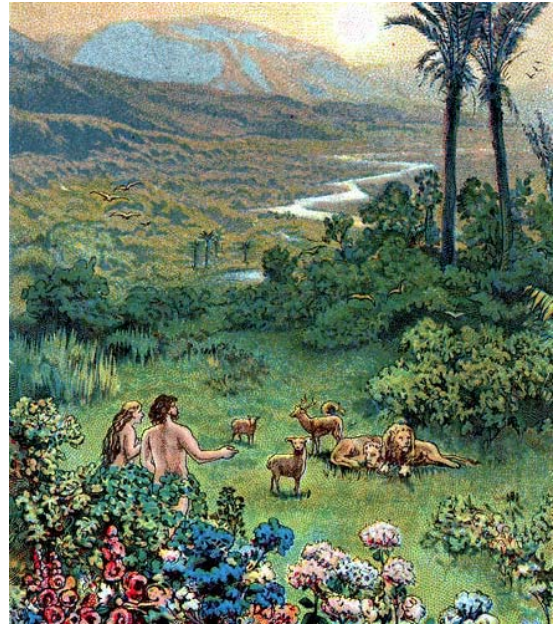

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LESSON - 5

MOSES - THE CARE OF GOD

Exodus 2:1 - 10

Aim: - To learn that God cares for those who trust in Him and depend on Him.

The Princess entrusted her with the child "You should bring up the child properly. I will pay you. When the breast feeding ends you should bring the child back to me" Miriam and her mother thanked God for his great mercy. When the breast feeding was over the child was brought back to the princess. The princess named him Moses meaning, "Pulled out of water". Moses grew up as the step son of the princess. He became wise and strong. God used Moses for liberating Israel from the hands of Pharaoh the king of Egypt and to lead them to Canaan the Promised Land.

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LESSON 6

(I: Samuel 1:1-28)

Aim: - To understand that God will surely hear the prayers with tears and deep conviction.

Canaan was taken in possession by Israel and they lived there. At that time, God's temple was in a place called Shiloh. God's priest was Eli.

During that time there lived a man named Elkanah in the village of Ramah in Ephraim. He had two wives. Hannah and Peninnah.

Hannah had no children for which she was very sad. Due to this Elkanah loved Hannah more. Elkanah, along with his wives and children used to go to the temple in Shiloh for praying. One day Hannah went to the temple alone. She prayed there for a child with sorrow and tears. "God, give me a child. 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LESSON- 9

TRUE GOD

(2 Kings 5-1-19)

Aim: - To understand that Yahweh alone is the True God.

In the town of Samaria, in Israel there lived a prophet called Elisha. He taught the people about the true God. But the people of Israel sinned. They worshipped heathen Gods. So god punished them. The King of Aram in Syria attacked Samaria. He conquered the city and looted it. He took many people to Syria as slaves. Among them there was a very beautiful girl. Naaman, the commander in chief of the army gave her as a maid servant to his wife. She called her "Judith". Judith was very pious. She had great respect for Elisha the prophet.

The King of Aram honoured Naaman with high positions and titles. But he couldn't rejoice for he had become a leper. Many doctors treated him but could not cure him. Judith was very desirous to help her master. Taking courage she told her mistress wife "If only my master goes to Elisha, the prophet in Samaria surely he will be healed." Naaman was in despair because of the disease. When he heard this he immediately set out to Samaria with an order from the King of Syria. The King of Syria had written to the King of Samaria to cure Naaman, his servant, of leprosy. King of Israel was rather astonished and cried out "who can cure leprosy!" He thought The King of Syria was seeking reason for another attack. The King was very much worried and he really wept. Hearing the King of Samaria is upset, Elisha sent a messenger to him requesting him to send Naaman to him.

In response to this, Naaman came before the door step of Elisha. The prophet sent his servant and asked Naaman to go to the river Jordan and immerse himself seven times in the river for getting cleaned. Naaman was really annoyed thinking that the prophet did not respect him. Naaman had expected the prophet would come near and pray to cure him. Naaman felt insulted and became angry. He said, "We have better rivers in Syria" and decided to return home.

But his servants pleaded with him, "It is something very simple, please just try it". Even though Naaman did not like it he went to Jordan reluctantly and immersed himself seven times in the water. What a miracle! He was completely cured. All were astonished. Naaman came before Elisha's door step again with great joy. Prostrating before the prophet he said, "Yahweh is the true God and we will worship him only".

The ways of God are mysterious. We may not understand them. They, who obey God with faith and without any doubt, will receive many many blessings.

Due to the love of Judith, Naaman got an opportunity to get himself cured and to know the true God.

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LESSON 10

MARY'S DEDICATION

(Luke 1: 26-38)

Aim: To teach that God lives in those who are humble.

(Note: Luke 1:28 in English and Syriac authorized versions, it is written, "Blessed art thou among women". But in Malayalam Bible it is omitted.)

Disobeying God, Adam and Eve sinned against God. God was pleased to give his only Son to the world to liberate man from sin through his incarnation. Nothing is impossible for God.

In Nazareth in Galilee, there lived a girl, Mary, who was pure at heart. She was betrothed to Joseph, a carpenter. But the marriage ceremony was not over. God selected Mary as the mother of the Son of God. God sent the angel Gabriel with his message. Gabriel saluted Mary and said, "Mary, full of grace! Peace be with you. God is with you and you are the most blessed among women." What a glorious salutation!

Mary was worried about this salutation. She wondered what it meant. Gabriel further added, "Mary, do not be afraid. God has been gracious to you. You will become pregnant and will give birth to a son who shall be named Jesus. He will be called the Son of God." This was the message of salvation.

"I am not yet married. Then how can this happen?" Mary asked. Gabriel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come onto you. God's power will rest upon you. For this reason, the Holy Baby will be called the Son of God." Mary became pregnant by the Holy Spirit through the power of God. "Nothing is impossible for God", Gabriel further added.

Mary bowed her head in humility. Dedicating fully to the will of God, she said, "Here am I, the Lord's servant. May it happen to me as you have said." In Mary, we see unparalleled humility. Due to this amazing incomparable humility, Mary earned the eligibility to become the mother of the Son of God.

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LESSON 11

THE BIRTH OF JESUS CHRIST

(Luke 2: 1-20)

Aim: To learn that those who are pure at heart will hear the Good news from God.

At the time of the birth of Christ, Israel was under the rule of the Roman Empire. Augustus Caesar was the Emperor at that time. (Caesar is the official title of the Roman Emperor) The Caesar ordered an enumeration in his empire. This is just like the present day census. At that time, the census was taken clan by clan. One would go to the original place of his clan to register the name, even if one was living far away. Joseph belonged to the clan of David. So Joseph along with Mary went to Bethlehem, the town of David, to register their names. Mary was in her advanced stage of pregnancy. When they reached Bethlehem, Mary became very tired. The labor pain also started. There was a heavy rush in Bethlehem. She had not even a place to rest or sleep. At last Joseph found a cattle shed. He made a little space among the cattle for Mary to lie down. There she gave birth to the Son of God, who humbled himself for us and was pleased to be born in a modest place among the cattle. Mary wrapped the child in clothes and laid him down in the manger.

This wonderful news was made known to the whole world by the angels themselves. In the night, in a field near Bethlehem, a group of shepherds were keeping watch over their sheep around a fire. Suddenly, a heavenly light shone over them. The angel of God stood beside them. "Don't be afraid, I bring you good news of great joy which is meant for all people. This very day in David's town, your savior, Christ the Lord, is born". The angels told them the place of birth. At that time, a group of angels stood in a line over them in the sky. They sang a heavenly song.



'Glory to God in the highest heaven and peace on earth. And good hope for the humans.'

The shepherds were wonderstruck. God selected the shepherds who were pure at heart to hear this divine gospel. The shepherds believed what the angels told them. They went to Bethlehem that very night and got inside the cattle shed. Just as the angels informed them, they saw the child lying in the manger. They bowed before him. They said all the things they saw and heard to Joseph and Mary. All were amazed. Praising God, the shepherds went back to their sheep.

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Lesson- 12

THE STAR THAT ROSE IN THE EAST

(Matthew2:1-23)

Aim: To learn that human strength cannot defeat the will of God.

(For the teacher: Number of the wise men (Magi) is not mentioned in the Bible. It is not mentioned if they were kings or not but definitely they were wise. That they were three in number is traditionally accepted as there were three gifts. It was in a house that the wise men worshipped baby Jesus. Matthew 2: 11).

When Jesus was born a new star rose in the east. The wise men realized that this signified the birth of the redeemer and eternal king God promised the Jews. So they started their journey to Jerusalem to see this king. After traveling for several days they reached the palace of the king in Jerusalem. The king of Judea that time was Herod. They told the king that they have come to pay homage to the king of Jews whose star they saw in the east. The king was greatly disturbed on hearing this. He knew that the Jews were waiting for the Messiah. He called upon the chief priest and teachers of the law and asked them where the Messiah would be born. They answered that according to the scriptures it would be in Bethlehem of Judea.

King Herod found out from the wise men the time they saw the new star. He told them to let him know if they found the baby, as he also wanted to go and worship the baby. But the king had cruel thoughts in his mind. He decided to kill the baby somehow.

The wise men started towards Bethlehem. Suddenly, the star they saw in the east was in the sky in front of them. They were very happy. The star traveled in front of them and stopped at the place in Bethlehem where baby Jesus was present. The wise men went to that house. They found baby Jesus along with His Mother Mary. They bowed down and worshipped Him. They gave gifts of gold, myrrh and incense to the baby.



Since the angel of God warned them in their dreams not to go back to King Herod, they returned to their country by another route. God's angel appeared to Joseph in his dream and told him to escape to Egypt with mother and baby because King Herod was planning to kill them. He was to stay in Egypt till God ordered. Joseph obeyed.

King Herod realized that the wise men had fooled him. He became furious. From the time the star was seen, he calculated the age of baby Jesus. He sent soldiers and killed all the babies of age 2 yrs old and under, in and around Bethlehem. He believed that Jesus also got killed. But baby Jesus had escaped already. After sometime, King Herod died. As ordered by the angel of God, Joseph returned with baby Jesus and Mary. They lived in Nazareth of Galilee. What God has planned cannot be changed by human strength.

God's Son was born as a human being to give salvation to all humanity.

Lesson- 13

JESUS IN TEMPLE-THE MODEL BOY

(Luke2:41-51)

Aim: To learn that going to church is to pray and listen to the words of God.

Jesus grew up in Nazareth with his mother and stepfather Joseph. As he grew older he was getting wiser.

Joseph and Mary used to go every year to the Jerusalem temple for the Passover feast. They used to take boy Jesus along with them.

Jesus was 12 years old. As usual they went to Jerusalem for the Passover feast. City of Jerusalem and the temple would be crowded that time. Boy Jesus entered the temple and prayed and offered sacrifice along with his parents. Temple is the place to pray and worship God.

Boy Jesus saw teachers of law sitting in one part of the temple and reading and learning the laws. He went to them. Those scholarly people asked Jesus some questions from the laws and they were amazed at his answers.



His knowledge was so deep. Those teachers made him sit among them. They discussed the words of God.

In the meantime Joseph and Mary started their journey back to Nazareth. They were unaware that Jesus was left behind. They thought that he must be amongst friends as usual. Those days people used to walk from place to place. After one day of travel only they looked for their son. They were very worried when he was not found among relatives and friends. With great grief they returned to Jerusalem looking for their son all along the way. 3 days later they found him in the temple sitting amongst the scholars and discussing with them. Everyone was amazed at his wisdom.

Mary went to him and said "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you". Jesus answered, "Why were you searching for me? Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house"?

Then boy Jesus got up and went with his parents to Nazareth. He was an obedient son to them. God is our father. Church is the house of our father. Jesus taught us that. Like Jesus who obeyed his parents and grew up as a model boy we must also obey our parents and grow up as good children.

WATER BECAME WINE

THE FIRST MIRACLE OF JESUS

(JOHN 2:1 - 11)

Aim: - To learn that Jesus is the Creator of every thing.

When Jesus was thirty years old he began his public Ministry of salvation. He preached the Gospel of the kingdom of God in the towns of Galilee. He had many disciples too.

He selected twelve from them and named "Apostles".

There was a marriage at Cana a village in Galilee. Mother Mary was there. Jesus also was invited to the marriage with his disciples. Jesus and his disciples came just at the time of the feast. While the feast was going on there arose a shortage of wine. Wine was a very important item in a feast. When wine became out of stock the host felt ashamed. Mary saw this and felt sympathy.

Mary was confident that only Jesus could solve the problem. But Jesus said ". What have you to do with me; my hour has not yet come." But Mary never thought that Jesus had turned down her request. There were six large stone vessels in the house. Jesus said to the servants to fill jars with water. They filled them up to the brim. Then he asked the servants them "Now serve it to the steward of the feast". An item could be served to the guests only if the chief of the feast allowed it. The servants did as Jesus ordered.

The chief of the feast found it very good. "What a fine wine"! He wondered. He called the bride groom and complemented, "You were keeping high quality wine up to this time". Only the disciples of Christ and the servants of the house knew from where this wine had come. Water had been changed to super quality wine. All were amazed at it. His disciples believed in him. This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana and showed his glory, his disciples believed in him. Jesus performed the first miracle in obedience to his mother.

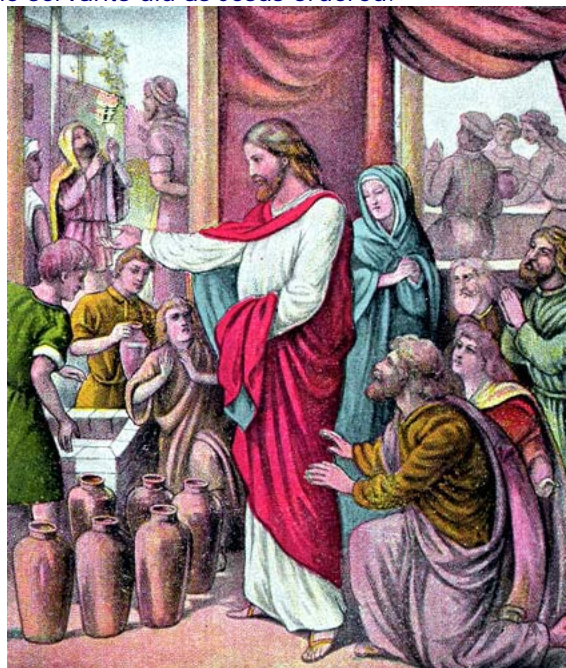
This miracle teaches that Jesus is the Son of God who created everything in this world.

(Luke. 15: 11 - 32)

Aim: -To understand that God the Father loves us.

God is our father, God loves us. While we disobey the commands of God and commit sin, God, become sad. He is extremely glad when we repent and give up our sins. To teach this Jesus told the parable of prodigal son.

A rich man had two sons. The younger one demanded his share. The father was very sad about it. Yet the loving father divided the property in between his sons. Without delay the younger one sold his part and left home with the money. He might have thought that without any control from his father he could live as he wished. Because there was cash in his hand and he had many friends, he enjoyed life eating and drinking. He spent every thing he had. Then the friends also left him one by one. He became alone without any means even for a single meal. While we select friends we should be careful. We need friends with good character and faith in God as our friends.

A severe famine spread over the country and he began to be in want with hunger. He was compelled to work in a farm to take care of the pigs. Even then he could get food only once or twice a day. He wished to satisfy his hunger by eating the food of pigs. His master did not allow even that. What a pitiable condition! All this happened only because he abandoned his father.

One day he remembered his father. He deeply felt his wrongs He decided return to his father. He returned to his house with repentance.

Father had been very sorry about his son. One day he saw the son coming from a distance. Seeing his son wearing dirty clothes, father felt sad at his heart. The Father rushed to embraced his son and kissed him, The son said, in weeping, "father I have sinned against heaven and before you I am no longer worthy to be called your son" The Father rejoiced very much in getting back his lost son. He called the servants and asked them to arrange a very good feast. Bathed him, and put on him the best robe and put a ring on his finger.

By this time the elder son came from the field after work. Seeing the feast and celebration he enquired the reason for it. He was very much annoyed. He remained out side the house. His father came out and tried to console him.

"You have arranged this feast for the son who has wasted everything you gave him" the elder son protested. But the father said "your brother was dead but now he is alive. He was lost, but now he has been found. So shall we not rejoice?"



When we forsake God we commit sin. When we sin we become dead. When we repent and returned to the fold of God we get life again.
